STATUS REPORT FILED BY THE 14th RESPONDENT

- I, Dr. Shekhar Kumar Niraj, Son of Late Dr. Prasad aged about 57 years, employed as Principal Chief Conservator of Forests & Chief Wildlife Warden, Panagal Maaligai, Saidapet, Chennai-15, do hereby solemnly affirm and sincerely state as follows:-
- 2. I am the 14th respondent herein and as such I am well acquainted with the facts of the case from the available records. I am filing the status report in response to the orders of the Hon'ble High Court of Madras dated: 23.02.2021, 27.04.2021, 30.06.2021 22.07.2021, 03.09.2021 and 24.09.2021.
- 3. It is respectfully submitted that this Writ Petition has been filed by the petitioner with prayer to issue a Writ of Mandamus or any

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other appropriate writ, order or directions in the nature of Writ of Mandamus directing

(a) the respondents 3 to 13 to allocate a minimum of 10 acres of land/grove for the Elephant Andal and Elephant Lakshmi on the banks of river Kollidam or any other suitable place as this Hon'ble Court deems fit and move Elephant Andal and Elephant Lakshmi to the allotted location.

(b) the respondents 14 to 16, to submit a white paper on the status of the welfare of the elephants, the periodical medical assistance provided to the captive elephants, the processes that are in place to monitor the captive elephants as per the statutory requirements and consequently direct the authorities to enforce the statutory requirements as per law.

(c) the respondents 3 to 13 to re-appoint Mr. Sridharan as mahout of Elephant Andal and Mr. Venkatesan as Mahout of the Elephant Lakshmi as per section 4(4) of the Tamilnadu Captive Elephants (Management and Maintenance) rules, 2011.

(d) the respondents 1 to 3 to allocate at least one male elephant to be housed either in Srirangam or M.R. Palayam Elephant Rescue center, to serve the 11 female elephants (7 in M.R.Palayam camp, 2 in Sri Ranganathaswamy Temple, 1 in Sri Jambugeswarar Temple and 1 in Sri Thayumana Swamy Temple) to enable them to reproduce in captivity.

4) In this regard, the Hon'ble High Court, Madras has issued orders on 27.08.2021. The operative portion of the order is as follows:-

"It would be best if the District Level Committees for the welfare of elephants were set up immediately in all districts and the State Level Committee was also constituted with appropriate personnel. At least, the exercise should be commenced, so that

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the relevant committees may be in place a few months down the line".

As per the order and in dealing with the matter the following, inter alia, are submitted categorically,

5) For compliance of the order, nominations have been called for from the District Forest Officers / Wildlife Wardens and Member Convener, District Level Captive Elephant Welfare Committees and nominations are being received from them. The details are mentioned below.

6) That the Principal Chief Conservator of Forests & Chief Wildlife Warden has conducted virtual meeting with all District Forest Officers/Wildlife Warden regarding the constitution of District Level Captive Elephant Welfare Committees. It is also submitted that 15 out of 18 districts where the private and temple elephants are being maintained have sent their nominations for the District Level Captive Elephant Welfare Committee and nominations are awaited from the remaining 3 Districts namely Vellore, Tirunelveli and Kanniyakumari. After receiving nominations from those Districts, proposal will be sent to the Government for re-constitution of District Level Captive Elephant Welfare Committees.

7) The Hon'ble High Court, Madras has also issued orders on 03.09.2021. The operative portion of the order is as follows:-

"10. The Principal Chief Conservator of Forests will prepare a catalogue of all captive elephants in this State. Videorecordings of all such elephants, together with complete profile of each elephant, including the age, sex, lineage, if possible, should be indicated. Every Endeavour should be made to indicate how the elephant came to be captured or domesticated. The exercise should be completed by obtaining video-recordings of all the captive elephants in the State and providing the profile features in course of such video-recording or otherwise.

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11. As far as the temple elephants are concerned, the Principal Chief Conservator of Forests should assign appropriate officials, along from the relevant areas, to inspect along with doctors from the relevant areas, to inspect the elephants and ascertain the state of their health. This exercise may be conducted for all captive elephants in the State, but beginning with elephants in the temple.

12. The number of elephants available with the forest officials should be indicated with similar profile and the history of how the animal came to be captured or used by forest officials. It is also necessary to ascertain whether any practice continues in which elephants are captured today, if only for the purpose of use by forest officials; and the permissibility thereof.

13. Several aspects of how elephants are treated by forest officials have been indicated in the presentation made by Elsa Foundation. The Principal Chief Conservator of Forests should respond to such aspect of the matter by way of a report that may be filed. At any rate, the video-recordings as sought by this order should also be accompanied by a small report detailing how the video-recording was prepared, so that an element of accountability and authentication is evident.

14. The appropriate departments of the State Government, be it the Animal Welfare or Animal Husbandry or the like department, should extend all cooperation. The Animal Welfare Board of India and if there is any State level corresponding body should be kept informed of the matters for rendering science based assistance in the conduct of this matter and the treatment of elephants and in particular and wildlife in general.

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8) The Hon'ble High Court, Madras has also issued orders on 03.09.2021. The operative portion of the order is as follows:-

"2. Mr.C. Harsha Raj, learned counsel appearing for the State, submits, on instructions, that there are 32 elephants in temples

in the State and 31 elephants privately held, in addition to the 64

elephants under the custody of the Forest Department.

3. According to Elsa Foundation, which has been permitted to

intervene in the present proceedings, the State had furnished

details of 86 captive elephants to the Ministry of Environment and Forests in 2019, excluding the elephants with the Forest

Department. It is submitted that the figures indicated in court

today would reveal that at least 23 elephants are no longer

available between 2019 and now.

4. The State should produce the statements, if any, furnished

to the Ministry of Environment and Forests over the last five

years regarding the number of elephants and other material

connected to elephants.

5. The State should ensure that no further elephant is taken

into captivity except for the purpose of treatment of such

elephants if found unable to support itself in the wild. No private

person may capture any elephant or keep the same except those

already existing".

9) That in compliance of the orders passed by the Hon'ble High

Court, Madras in W.P. Nos. 3656, 3660, 3662 & 3663 of 2021, I have

17) That four wild elephants were captured from various places after 31.05.2021 to reduce the human animal conflicts and 5 orphaned calf elephant were rescued and one private elephant was translocated to the Forest Department run camps. It is also submitted that several other injured/ diseased elephants were captured for treatment and after providing treatment, they were released back into the wild. It is respectfully submitted that the elephants are only captured on extreme human elephant conflict situations and for treating the injury / disease and they are not captured for the sake of capturing.

18) That the captured or rescued elephants are maintained with high quality medical care and food at departmental camps and no such elephants are gifted or sold to the private persons or temples. Only the diseased / ill treated temple and private elephants are brought to the Elephant Rescue and Rehabilitation center, M.R. Playam, Trichy for proper veterinary care and maintenance. Hence it is submitted that the Forest Department has not traded any Captive Elephants against the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972 and guidelines issued by the Government of India. As per the act in force, ownership of the Captive Elephant can only be by inheritance or acquisition by Government agencies by captive transfer, etc.,

24) That the Captive Elephant Santhakumari mentioned in the list that was sumitted to the Government of India was illegally transported from Kerala to Tamil Nadu without a mandatory Transit

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Permit. The elephant was no longer maintained in Tamil Nadu and supposed to be sent back the State of Kerala.

- 25) That one elephant named Lakshmi (Microchip No. 00065870BE) maintained by Thiru. M. Soundararajan, 24/4, Subba Muthali Street, Palani, Dindigul District was transported to Animal Rescue Centre, Rajapalayam for medical treatment. During the treatment, it has been found that the microchip reader reads different number and found that it was elephant illegally transported from Kerala to Tamil Nadu and the name of the elephant is "Indhira" (Microchip No. 00065DE113) and further medical treatment is being provided to the elephant 'Indhira' and offence is booked against Thiru. M. Soundararajan, 24/4, Subba Muthali Street, Palani, Dindigul District for illegally changing the elephant and the Captive Elephant originally named as "Lakshmi" is missing and investigation is being conducted for finding the original elephant "Lakshmi".
- 26) The Captive Elephant "Rita Kumari" is having origin of Andaman & Nicober islands and owner of the Captive Elephant was Shri. N. Nagarajan, S/o. Nagalingam Pillai, Kandamannur, Theni and it was maintained by Thiru. V. Mani, S/o S. Velu, Kappuvilai, Kalkulam (Tk), Verkizhambi (PO), Kanniyakumari. The Captive Elephant was illegally transported to Kumbakonam and was being maintained there. Hence, an offence has been booked in WLOR No. 1/2021 and affidavit has been filed in JM Court-II, Kumbakonam. Meanwhile, the elephant was again illegally transported to Kanniyakumari where it has been originally maintained. Hence, it was unable to conduct inspection of the said elephant. It is informed that the inspection report and Video recordings for the Captive Elephant "Rita Kumari" will be submitted shortly.

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27) That the Captive Elephant "Malolan" maintained in Alohiba Mutt, East Tambaram was transported to Kerala in 2015 with 5 years of Transit Permit and was not returned to Tamil Nadu (Transit Permit lapsed on 2020). The owner of the Captive Elephant "Malolan" has been instructed for bringing back to its original location.

28) That I am submitting the catalogue (Captive Elephant Data Sheet as per Tamil Nadu Captive Elephant (Management & Maintenance) Rules, 2011) and Video recordings for all the above mentioned Captive Elephants (Private elephants, Temple Elephants and Departmental elephants except Ritakumari, Lakshmi and Malolan) in the State of Tamil Nadu (Enclosed as Annexure I, II, III, IV & V).

29) That for complying the order of the Hon'ble High Court regarding daily routine of the Captive Elephants, an expert committee consisting of following members has been formed to prepare draft guidelines regarding the daily routine of the Captive Elephants.

 Dr. Kalaivanan, B.V.Sc., (Team Leader) (Through Director, Animal Husbandry Department)

2. Dr. Ashraf, N.V.K., Wildlife Trust of India, New Delhi

3. Dr. A. Sukumar, B. V. Sc., Forest Veterinary Officer, Coimbatore

4. Dr. K. Rajesh, B. V. Sc., Mudumalai Tiger Reserve

5. Dr. Nigel, B.V.Sc., Masinagudi

30) That an online meeting was convened by the Principal Chief Conservator of Forests & Chief Wildlife Warden with the committee members on 22.09.2021 for preparing draft guidelines regarding the daily routine of the Captive Elephants and for discussing the welfare of Captive Elephants in scientific manner.

31) That Dr. Kalaivanan, Team Leader of the committee has been involved in the operation of capturing the Tiger T-23 in Gudalur, it

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was unable to conduct the next meeting for preparing the guidelines and hence it is submitted that the meeting will be conducted and guidelines will be formed shortly.

32) That replies to the Hon'ble High Court's directions on Captive Elephants participating in the temple rituals and functions are furnished below.

33) The Transit Permit for the Captive Elephants for participating in the temple rituals and functions are issued based on the guidelines issued in the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972. It is also submitted that the Transit Permit is only given for the maximum period of 15 days at a time and the minimum period for rest of the Captive Elephant is 10 days before the next Transit Permit.

34) That the minimum gap of participating in two functions must be 2 days. The temple authorities have also been instructed to provide water, food and shelter facilities during the function. The owner and Mahout of the concerned elephant have also been instructed to strictly follow the rules and guidelines issued in the Transit Permit and Tamil Nadu Captive Elephant (Management & Maintenance) Rules, 2011 during the function. Forest Range Officer of the concerned Range where the function is being conducted is monitoring the Captive Elephant during the function and offence is booked against the owner of the elephant, when violation of rules occurred.

35) That the detailed reply for the presentation done by the Elsa Foundation is furnished below.

"The **Indian elephant** (*Elephas maximus indicus*) is one of three extant recognized subspecies of the Asian elephant and they usually lives in small family groups led by old females and the calf elephants

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are taken care by the herd. Most males (bulls) live in bachelor herds apart from the cows".

36) Elephants of all ages and sexes secrete a fluid called temporin. Male elephants, however, enter a "musth period," during which they secrete a fluid differing in viscosity from the fluid secreted when they are not in musth. The male elephants in the herds are driven away from the herd by other elephants in herd during their "Musth period". During the 'Musth Period" animal's behaviour is erratic and uncontrollable and males are usually at their prime physical state during musth and ordinarily do most of the breeding.

37) Capturing of Menaceful elephants

When, the elephants are separated from their herds and due to scarcity of food and attracted by the crops in villages nearby the forests, the elephants do crop raiding in the villages, which leads to human elephant conflicts in that area especially in the Western Ghats districts of Kanyakumari, Tirunelveli, Virudhunagar, Madurai, Theni, Dindigul, Coimbatore and Nilgiris and in the Eastern Ghats districts of Erode, Krishnagiri and Dharmapuri though this issue do occur in other parts of the State as well.

38) Forest Department have taken enormous measures to contain human elephant conflicts. Elephant Proof Trench, Solar Fence, Steel Wire Rope Fences, Hanging Solar Fences and Walls in the Forest boundaries have been constructed and forest ponds, water holes and check dams have been constructed to meet out the need for water for the Wildlife and green fodder banks have been created inside the Reserved Forest areas. Further, salt licks are provided near the water holes along the migratory corridor to supplement the mineral requirements of the elephants, which are

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expected to retain the elephants in their restricted migratory path and for

avoiding the Wildlife entering into the villages.

39) Also, teams like Anti Depredation Watchers, Anti Poaching

Watchers and Rapid Response teams have been created for driving the

elephants back into the forests. However, despite various efforts taken by the

Forest Department, some wild elephants attracted by the food grains and

certain fruit types, e.g., banana and mango kept in households in nearby

villages raid crops and attack the human if they are encountered on their

ways. Compensations are readily provided to the affected people for crop

damages, property damages, injuries and loss of life.

40) When problems due elephant increase in those areas and become

unmanageable, the Forest Department officials capture that elephant and

the captured elephant is translocated to any of the Reserve Forests and

released in the wild or kept in departmental captivity. This is a standardized

management practice as per the science of wildlife management and is

decided on case to case basis.

41) Capturing of injured elephants

Forest Department, sometimes, also capture wild elephants if they are

found deeply injured or extremely sick, or when the life of the

elephant is in danger by some accident or natural cause. In most

of such times, the injured elephant is treated for its injury in situ in the wild

with help of the Forest Veterinary Unit and released into the Forests. After

the release the elephant is monitored by the field staff. Other measures,

such as providing medicines placed in fruits and kept on the on the elephant

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movement paths. When the injured or a disabled is elephant found to be unable to support itself in the wild, those elephants are captured and brought to the captivity for providing medical treatment.

42) Rescue of Orphaned calf elephants

Forest Department also rescue calf elephants when they are found irreversibly separated from their mothers and fall out of the herd. Initially measures have been taken for reuniting the separated calf with the herd. In most of such times all possible efforts are made to reunite the calves with their herd. If such reunion of the calves does not succeed due to some reason, the calves are brought up to the Elephant Camps as they would survive on their own in the wild. Such calves are maintained with the other elephants in the camps using standard operating procedures.

43) Capturing Process

The practice of capturing wild Asian elephants and then taming and training them for work originated approximately 4000 years ago as per the epical references. The Matangaleela, a rendition of the Gajashastra, by the Sanskrit poet Nilakanta, talks of five different techniques that can be used for capturing elephants—pens or stockades; using female elephants as bait; noosing the elephant; following the animal till it tires out and then restraining it; and placing a noose in a small pit and then attracting the elephant to the pit using food. Due to scientific advancements, the menaceful / injured elephants are captured using the tranquilization methods, where drugs are injected through the tranquilizing guns under the expert supervision of the Forest Veterinary Doctors with minimum trauma to the animal. The tranquilized elephants are taken into the camps through large vehicles with the help of the kumki elephants and they are maintained in the

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kraal during for treatment / taming. The injured elephants treated for their wound / disability before the taming or training process.

44) Process of Taming or training:-

The method used for taming the captured elephant is human positive reinforcement or reward based training. In the elephant camps, there are local tribal communities used for taming of the elephants. In parts of the Nilgiris (Mudumalai Tiger Reserve), the communities involved are the Panivas, Kurubas, Jainikkurubas, Betta-kurubas, and sometimes, the Kattunaikkas. In Anamalai Tiger Reserve, the elephant trainers, and mahouts hail predominantly from the Malasar community, with a few individuals from the Kadar community.

- 45) The traditional way of training an elephant involves establishing dominance through various methods. Forceful submission, the most common of these has drawn criticism globally. This method is mostly used during open training of the animals, a practice generally followed in Northeast India and Southeast Asia. During open training, the elephant has more opportunity to display resistance and aggression, potentially endangering the trainer's life. This method, therefore, leads to the animal being subject to more torture to control its behaviour.
- 46) Forest Department of Tamil Nadu only uses the closed training system, where the captured elephant is confined within a standard 12 feet x 12 feet kraal or a boma (Wooden enclosure). The floors of the kraals are made of wooden slats

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with gaps in between that prevent them from becoming damp. The roof is made of tiles or sheets. A small tank or large drum of water is provided. It has been ensured that no sharp edges, nails present in the Kraal that could harm the elephant.

47) The elephant men use the same vocal and tactile commands and employ a mixture of positive reinforcement/rewards-based training. They have been trained for recognising the thin line between punishment and cruelty. Punishment in this context does not necessarily involve physically harming the animal. Rather, it is meant to prevent undesirable behaviour, such as charging at the mahout, displaying conspecific aggression, causing damage to property, or becoming unpredictable or disobedient at work. This 'punishment' can involve threatening the animal with loud or harsh vocal commands, showing the stick, splashing water on the elephant's face and, sometimes, mild physical punishment. More importantly, the elephant men (Mahouts) start the training process by feeding the animal. The first step is usually familiarisation with the mahout's voice, which is done through repeated verbal commands. Initially, a captured wild elephant will display aggressive behaviour, resistance and it will try to hit the wooden bars of the kraal. A raised voice, or a sudden dominance gesture by the mahout, usually prevents this. Once the elephant starts responding to the mahout positively, it

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begins to use its trunk to accept food and it is taught to obey the command 'Jharak!' by standing close to the bars of the kraal to take food (twigs, bamboo, grass stalks or sugarcane).

48) That, usually, in about 30 days, the animal would

begin to accept the mahout's interventions and would take food

directly from his hands. About a week later, after the mahout

has further established his relationship with the elephant, he

will enter the kraal to feed and to check the injuries of the

elephant. For that a system called 'protected contact' is used,

wherein the elephant is kept inside a larger enclosure and has

minimal physical contact with the keeper, thereby avoiding risk.

49) That the ideal training method begins with the treatment by the Forest Veterinary Doctor for injuries and wounds of the elephant, if any. Then the elephant men (Mahout) proceeds with habituation of the elephant, which is a gradual process requiring much patience. Mahouts who lack the necessary patience often fail in this approach and hence necessary training and instructions have been provided by the Old and experienced mahouts. Gradual habituation through vocal and limited tactile communication through the bars of the kraal establishes a bond between the mahout and the animal.

This method differs from others in that it does not push the

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- 50) That while kraal training involves establishing a relationship between the elephant and the mahout and the elephant listening to the vocal and tactile commands of the mahout, it is important to have follow-up sessions for the elephant and its mahout to bond more deeply. Initially, the mahout will establish a daily routine of taking the animal to the river and having long scrubbing/bathing sessions, during which the mahout communicates with the animal. He will take the animal for walks and for fodder collection and keep its confinement to a minimum. The elephants in training are brought out and taken to the river with the help of kumkis and these sessions provide an opportunity for observational learning. During this initial period, the mahout, sitting atop the elephant, also slowly teaches the elephant foot commands.
- 51) That the rescued orphan calf elephants are not used in the taming process, as they quickly learn the process and closely bonded with the mahout very easily.
- 52) That the elephants captured for its injury / disability are first treated for their injuries before starting the taming process. Usually, the taming period varies for elephants, as the learning ability for the elephants differs. The process of taming Page No. 44

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Principal Chief Conservator of Forests and Chief Widllife Warden Chennai-15 has become more advanced these days and the elephants are treated scientifically and psychologically by the Forest Veterinary Doctors.

53) Illegal Transfer of elephants.

That the Tamil Nadu Forest Department has not traded any Captive Elephants against the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972 and Tamil Nadu Captive Elephant (Management & Maintenance) Rules, 2011 and guidelines issued by the Government of India. As per the act in force, ownership of the Captive Elephant can only be by inheritance or acquisition by Government agencies by captive transfer.

54) That the owners of 28 Captive Elephants in Tamil Nadu are reported to have other State Ownership Certificates. The Captive Elephants are transported to Tamil Nadu by Transit Permit for the limited period and overstayed in Tamil Nadu and not returned to their state of origin. After certain period, the temple or private person applies for Ownership Certificate in the State of Tamil Nadu, which is not permissible under the act. It is also submitted that measures have been taken for returning the other State elephants to the state of origin.

55) That as per the section 40 (2) of the Wildlife (Protection)
Act, 1972, viz

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(2) No person shall, after the commencement of this Act, acquire, receive, keep in his control, custody or possession, sell, offer for sale or otherwise transfer or transport any animal specified in Schedule I cr Part II of Schedule II or any uncured trophy or meat derived from such animal, or the salted or dried skins of such animal or the musk of a musk deer or the horn of a rhinoceros, except with the previous permission in writing of the Chief Wild Life Warden or the authorised officer.

(:2A) No person other than a person having a certificate of ownership, shall, after the commencement of the Wild Life (Protection) Amendment Act, 2002 (16 of 2003) acquire, receive, keep in his control, custody or possession any captive animal, animal article, trophy or uncured trophy specified in Schedule I or Part II of Schedule II, except by way of inheritance.

(2B) Every person inheriting any captive animal, animal article, trophy or uncured trophy under sub-section (2A) shall, within ninety days of such inheritance make a declaration to the Chief Wild Life Warden or the authorised officer and the provisions of sections 41 and 42 shall apply as if the declaration had been made under sub-section (1) of section 40:

(Provided that nothing in sub-sections (2A) and (2B) shall apply to the live elephant.)

56). That as per section 43 (1) of the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972,

"43. Regulation of transfer of animal, etc.—(1) No person having in his possession captive animal, animal article, trophy or uncured trophy in respect of which he has a certificate of ownership shall transfer by way of sale or offer for sale or by any other mode of consideration of commercial nature, such animal or article or trophy

or uncured trophy." Page No. 46

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- 57) That following clarification has been sought from the Government of India.
 - 1. As per Section 40 (2) of Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972, there is a provision for sale of Schedule I captive animal with the previous permission of Chief Wildlife Warden. However, the same has been subsequently appended with another Section 40 (2A) of Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972 limiting the transfer only by way of inheritance in respect of Schedule I captive animals excepting live elephant; implying live elephants still would be governed by the spirit of original Section 40 (2) of Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972.
 - 2. But Section 43 (1) of the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972, again places embargo on any sort of sale or by any mode of commercial nature, such transfer of Schedule I captive animal which covers live elephant. To circumvent this embargo, many requests of transfer by way of gift are presented in respect of live elephant.
 - 3. Necessary clarification as to the transfer of elephants by way of sale (as per Section 40 (2)) or by way of gift (as per Section 43 (1)) has been sought from the Government of India within the ambit of the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972.
 - 58) That as per Section 3 of the Tamil Nadu Captive Elephant (Management & Maintenance) Rules, 2011,

"The elephant donated to the temple should be in good health condition and that should be accepted only after obtaining prior permission of the Chief Wildlife Warden. Whenever an elephant is donated by private individuals or institutions to the temples, the State Level Committee appointed by Government shall scrutinize the

PERSONAL ASSISTANT TO THE CHIEF WILDLIFE WARDEN application regarding health, age and pedigree of the elephant and the infrastructure facilities, and the financial position of the temple and the donor and recommend to the Chief Wildlife Warden for consideration and passing appropriate orders under Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972 (Central Act 53 of 1972). The State Level Committee should also take into account, whether the donor would be able to meet out the annual maintenance cost as claimed by Temple authorities or in consolidated amount for several years together as one payment in the beginning."

59) That there are no legal provision for transfer of Ownership Certificate in the Tamil Nadu Captive Elephant (Management & Maintenance) Rules, 2011 and hence the Ownership Certificate is not issued for the Captive Elephants that are brought from other States.

60) Cruelty to Captive Elephants

That the Captive Elephants (both temple and private elephants) in Tamil Nadu are governed by Tamil Nadu Captive Elephant (Management & Maintenance) Rules, 2011 and under that the captive elephants are inspected regularly by the Forest Officials and Veterinary Doctors and instructions for maintenance are regularly given to the mahout and cavadies during the inspection. Appropriate strict action is taken against the defaulters who maintain the elephants improperly and indulge in ill-treatment of the elephants. Such regulation is backed up by the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972, Tamil Nadu Captive Elephant (Management & Maintenance) Rules, 2011 and the guidelines issued on maintenance of Captive Elephants by the Government of India, etc.

Principal Chief Conservator of Forests and Chief Widllife Warden Chennai-15. 61) That the injured / disabled Captive Elephants are generally brought to the Elephant Rescue and Rehabilitation Center, M.R. Palayam, Trichy for veterinary care and maintenance.

62) That according to the scientific research and recorded evidences, Captive Elephants have greater lifespan than the wild elephant, as the Captive Elephants get veterinary care and regular food with sometimes food supplements. Small injury or a wound to wild elephants could become serious and therefore are treated when noticed and reported. The Forest Department field staff monitor the wild elephants continuously and when an injury is noticed, the elephant is treated as stated in para no. 41.

63) Having said so, I pray before the Hon'ble Court to accept the status report and pass further orders or any other orders that may be deemed fit and appropriate according to the circumstances of the case for resolving the matter and rendering justice.
